Stockton's First Large Non-Congregate Emergency Shelter

- > A collaborative partnership between public, private and non-profit organizations to address the diverse needs of those living unsheltered. Each individual living unsheltered has unique needs. Those with special needs or health challenges often can't utilize traditional shelters. This new shelter concept fills a critical equity gap by opening doors for hundreds of individuals whose options for shelter are often limited.
- > Pathways removes four barriers to traditional congregate shelters:
 - 1) Accommodates pets
 - 2) Welcomes partners
 - 3) Provides **privacy** (one-bedroom units)
 - 4) Offers security for personal belongings
- > Easy access to life-changing support will help move nearly 300 people from the streets to apartments and houses. Clients housed at Pathways will be next door to supportive services, resources, and daily necessities. A consistent support network, substance-use treatment, and individualized case management will set clients up for a successful pathway to an apartment or house, typically within six months.
